#### SNOWMOBILES

Persons operating snowmobiles within the city limits must travel on designat- In the interest of public safety, the City of ed trails. Snowmobiles are prohibited from any public sidewalk/trail ways provided for pedestrian travel, on private property without the owner's permission, and all other public property unless designated as the snowmobile trail. There is no parking or riding of snowmobiles on the levee or in city parks, per Ordinance 208.

#### SIDEWALK SNOW REMOVAL

Rockford reminds you of the importance of keeping your walkways cleared of snow and ice. City Ordinance 901.04 states that www.riverworksonline.org all snow and ice must be removed from public sidewalks 24 hours after the snow or other precipitation causing the condition.

#### ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

This past year was one of change for the City of Rockford. Long time City Administrator, Nancy Carswell, retired after many years of dedicated service to our community. She continues to be involved by running the Farmer's Market and planning various other community-based activities throughout the year.

The summer and fall were busy times for development and growth, as the City purchased the struggling Rockford City Center Mall and updated the façade of the building to revitalize and support commercial businesses and services in our city. The old park shelter in Riverside Park was removed and plans are underway to replace the shelter this spring. Ice skating also returned to Rockford this winter, with a rink being constructed next to Riverside Park that we hope will serve the community well.

The City also took on infrastructure projects in Maplewood Manor and other parts of the city to address our aging utility mains and control inflow and infiltration into our utility system. The City also began construction on the Wastewater Treatment Plant to upgrade that facility pursuant to mandates established by the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency. These projects are nearing completion, with a few minor projects scheduled to be completed next spring. We thank the community for your patience during these projects and appreciate your understanding.

Looking forward, 2015 promises to be another busy year full of promise and opportunity. The housing market appears to be improving and we anticipate that some of our stagnant housing developments will experience new interest and construction over the coming year. The City's Housing Redevelopment Authority may be changing to an Economic Development Authority to provide more flexibility in attracting and retaining commercial and industrial businesses for our community. We hope you all have a safe and happy New Year, and we look forward to the exciting opportunities that 2015 has to offer!

# 2015 RECYCLING INFORMATION

The 2015 recycling calendars will be sent out in the *December 14th issue of The Drummer*. If you do not receive one, please call City Hall and we will send one out or you may pick one up.

Two sort recycling system: glass/cans/plastics #1-7 can be put together and paper/cardboard. Remember that cardboard must be flattened and no larger than 3x3. Recyclables must be set out at the curb by 7 a.m.

If you need a recycling bin stop by City Hall.

### SNOW SEASON PARKING

The snow season ordinance is in effect November 1st until April 1st and it shall be unlawful for any person to park a vehicle on or within six feet of the roadway between 2am-6am OR after ice accumulation, continuous or intermittent snow fall during which there has been an accumulation of two inches or more of snow on any street until the same has been plowed or removed from the full width of the roadway. On street parking is prohibited from 4am-6am on ALL non-residential streets regardless of snow. At NO TIME shall a vehicle be parked upon ANY street in any one place for more than twelve (12) hours. Please make sure that your guests are aware of these regulations so that they don't end up with a ticket or worse yet, getting towed

Have a safe winter and stay a safe distance behind the snow plows.
