Mayor Hafften called the **March 24, 2015** Regular Meeting of the Rockford City Council to order at 6:00 p.m. The meeting was held in the Council Chambers of City Hall at 6031 Main Street, Rockford, MN.

## **Roll Call**

Roll call was taken. The following Council Members were present: Hafften, Buoy, Hill, Kesanen, and Martinson. Absent: none. Also in attendance were: Engineer's Ward and Noreen, Administrator/Special Counsel Madsen, Public Works Supervisor Peterson, and Deputy Clerk Etzel.

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was given.

## Public Hearing/2014 Utility Project Lateral Repair and Proposed Assessments

Administrator Madsen noted the 2014 Utility Improvement Project began in 2014. Part of the project included utility main and lateral repairs to correct issues related to inflow and infiltration that were causing damage and increasing the cost of operation at the Wastewater Treatment Plant.

Properties in the designated project area were required to have their lateral sewer service inspected and properties with laterals showing damage or indications of inflow and infiltration were required to be repaired. The property owners were given the choice between handling the repairs on their own or pooling together and having the city contract for their repairs at the property owner's request. Those property owners requesting the city to conduct the repair realized the benefit of reduced costs due to the number of laterals repaired, and also were provided the benefit of having the cost of the repairs assessed to their properties to be repaid over a term of five, seven or ten years.

All property owners opting to request that the city conduct the repairs and assess the cost against their properties stated their request by signing a Lateral Service Repair Agreement which included an agreement and waiver of their right to object to the cost of process used in the lateral repairs.

The actual cost for the home owners were under the estimates received.

Mayor Hafften opened the Public Hearing at 6:03 p.m.

**Phyllis Velner** of **6630 Maple Drive** stated she tried to hire different contractors for the project, but Dennis Peterson told her that she could not use those contractors. She was charge \$7,000 and her quote was for \$3,000. These other contractors have done work in other cities and she would have preferred to use their services. Ms. Velner questioned why she had to pay so much when her lateral only took an hour and some of her neighbors took over three hours.

Alrene Schmitz of 6471 Maple Drive wanted to know if the lateral will be televised in the spring since there is only a one year warranty. Ms. Schmitz appreciated all the work Adam Noreen did with being on site during the project.

Staff noted all lateral repairs would be televised.

**Novald Osland** of **8611 Elm Street** stated he watched the cd provided showing how bad the lateral was at his house. Mr. Osland originally received an estimate of \$12,800 and his final bill was \$6,800. The company doing work had very expensive equipment, their workers were magnificent, and they did a great job! Roto-Rooter will not be happy now that his lines are repaired.

Mayor Hafften closed the Public Hearing at 6:12 p.m.

#### Limited Site Investigation (LSI) Project and Services

Dennis Peterson noted the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) is requiring the LSI due to previous diesel tank leak at the Public Works site. Peterson received bids from three different companies and Wenck Associates had the lowest bid of \$9,120.50.

Staff will apply for a refund from the Petrofund. Three quotes were one of the requirements to apply for the funds. The cost for the LSI is outside the scope of the WWTF project. The Petrofund application cost is \$500 to \$1000 and the remainder of the expense will be for the borings.

**MOTION** was made by Hill, seconded by Kesanen to approve Wenck Associates complete the LSI and apply for the Petrofund at a cost not to exceed \$9,120.50.
