### CITY OF ROCKFORD MAIN STREET PROJECT

After many months of discussion and review, the Council of the City of Rockford voted unanimously at the March 8<sup>th</sup>, 2016 Council Meeting to begin the Main Street improvement project this spring. The project entails several improvements to downtown Main Street, between Hwy 55 and Elm Street. Components

of the project will include improvements to downtown safety, infrastructure and aesthetics by removing overhead power lines, widening the sidewalks, installing new light poles and boulevard trees, and replacing portions of the storm sewer and water services within the Right of Way.

Construction for this project will occur in several phases, with the first phase scheduled to begin sometime in early April. City staff have met with several other cities that have completed similar projects



in an effort to structure our project with as little disruption to our residents and businesses as possible. A high level of communication with the community will be critical to the success of the construction process. The project will be funded through a combination of Tax Increment Financing and the restructuring of the

city's existing bond debt, and it is projected that the cost of this project will not be reflected in property tax levy increases or otherwise passed on to our community.

There will be numerous meetings over the next several months at which the various stages of construction and planning will be discussed. As always, the community is invited to attend those meetings or to contact city staff with interests or inquiries regarding this project.

#### COMPOST SITE

Minnesota state statute 115A.931 does allow yard to be mixed with municipal solid waste, so now what do you do with your clippings and brush? You can compost it in your backyard, you can pay a private hauler to pick it up, or you can take it to the city's compost site.

The city compost site is a great resource for residents. It allows for the proper disposal brush and yard waste without paying a private contractor and the finished compost is a great soil amendment for our Rockford clay. The organic matter in the compost and the biological life it supports can help loosen clay soils, and provides nutrients for turf, flowers or veggies. The city staff will turn and mix the compost pile to ensure even decomposition and heating but we need your help with what gets put into the pile. Please observe the following guidelines:

- Please remove all bags, bottles and flower pots.
- Yard waste mixed with rocks, metal, concrete, polystyrene foam, animal feces or foreign material is unacceptable.
- Landscape fabric does not decompose and is not allowed at the compost site.
- · Grass clippings, leaves, garden waste and all soft bodied plant material is acceptable for the compost pile.
- Brush, sticks and wood waste need to be separated from compostable yard waste. Woody plant material does not degrade as fast as soft bodied plants and needs to be handled separately

All wood waste and brush needs to be placed in the brush pile which is separate from the compost pile. The city hires a contractor to remove the wood waste from the site every fall. Please observe the following rules to help keep this cost minimal for the city:

- No stumps
- No lumber or landscape timbers
- No concrete
- No logs over 6" in diameter
- Place all leaves and grass clippings in the compost pile.

Hours of operation: Monday-Friday 7:30am-3:00pm Wednesday Evening 4:30-8:30pm Saturday 8:00am-noon

The compost site schedule is subject to weather and site conditions. Only material originating within the city limits is allowed at the site. No commercial lawn care or tree companies are allowed at the site. The site may also be closed if an illegal dumping creates a problem that needs to be corrected.

The compost site on Elm Street/CR 33 is scheduled to open to City of Rockford Residents on Friday, April 15th, depending on the weather.

You do not need to check out a key at city hall.

Items accepted: grass clippings, leaves and brush no larger than 3" in diameter. All bags used to transport composting must be removed.

NO OTHER DUMPING IS ALLOWED.

Finished compost material is also available at no charge to Rockford Residents.

The Ames-Florida-Stork House will be closed January 1st, 2016 through May 29th, 2016 for the installation of a new HVAC system. This system is part of a larger effort to better preserve and protect the Stork House and the thousands of artifacts housed inside. The vast majority of the cost to install this vital HVAC system is already in hand in the form of the MNHS Grant and matching funds provided by the City of Rockford.

There remains, however, a significant gap in funding for the project, and **we need your help** in closing it. The RAHS is asking members – past and present – donors, or anyone interested in preserving the Ames-Florida-Stork House and Rockford's history to make a donation to help us complete this important and unprecedented preservation project. Our suggested donation for the HVAC project is \$52 – or just \$1 per week for a year – but any and all support goes a long way toward reaching our goal of raising \$10,000 by July 1st to complete this much-needed project.
