New Business: Riverside Park Bluebird Houses – Girl Scout Troop #15016

The location of the houses would be in the more wooded areas of the park and the canoe launch area, with the Girl Scouts taking care of the on-going long term maintenance and upkeep of the houses. **MOTION** was made by Martinson, and seconded by Buoy, to approve the plan.

New Business: RiverWorks Food Shelf Fence, Boy Scout Eagle Scout Project

Lucas Robinson presented his idea to construct a garbage screening fence at the Food Shelf building located at 8230 Cedar Street. Robinson did a great job outlining the goals and anticipated benefit this project would have on the community. It was discussed that the location of the fencing may impact or impede the new Main Street design and handicapped accessibility to the sidewalks. It was also discussed that the location of the fence may impact the ability for the garbage trucks to access the garbage dumpster shielded by the fence. **MOTION** was made by Hill, and seconded by Graner, to approve the fence contingent on Robinson working with Trevor Brummer, Public Works Director, to find a proper location and layout.

MOTION CARRIED-VOTING IN FAVOR: Hafften, Buoy, Graner, Hill and Martinson.

Members of the City Council and staff then provided updates on the Main Street Project, street sealing, crack filling, County Road reconstruction and other matters happening around the city.

MOTION was then made by Martinson, and seconded by Hill, to adjourn the Council Meeting at approximately 6:31 p.m.
