CITY OF ROCKFORD PARKS DEPARTMENT

The City of Rockford has a Parks Department! This is unique for a city this size; smaller cities simply combine the work with the general public works. The differences are subtle, there is an employee with a title, Parks Lead Maintenance, as opposed to general maintenance, and the first priority is park maintenance rather than blending it in with all the other city projects needing attention. Now the department is only one full time employee along with a seasonal summer employee, and the parks employee also is in the on-call rotation for the water plant, plows snow and helps out with other projects as time dictates. The Public Works department as a whole also helps out with large park projects as needed, installing playground equipment, building hockey rinks, and getting ready for River Days to name a few, so overall Public Works operates as one large well oiled machine.

The Parks Lead Maintenance position has a diverse job description, certifications include; MN Tree Inspector license, MN Pesticide Applicator license, MN Class D Wastewater license, and is also a Certified Playground Safety Inspector. Job duties range from clearing ice and snow from sidewalks and trails to trying to make ice in the rinks where it seems to melt much easier than the stuff on the sidewalk. And it goes from stopping weeds that can grow in pavement to trying to coax grass from collapsed soils. We recently went from trying to find spots to mow that were not muddy, and then two weeks later hustling to get the irrigation systems running because the grass was desiccated.

May is by far the busiest month of the year. With everything greening up and the grass growing very rapidly keeping up mowing and trimming can be a challenge. Add in getting flowers and other spring plantings in the ground, co-coordinating service projects with Cub Scouts and Thousand Hearts, work-

ing with RAA on the Bankwest/Lamperts Field and finally getting everything trimmed and primed for Memorial Day, and May is quickly a memory. Then summer is upon us and the work continues with mowing and trimming, removing garbage from the parks, weekly playground inspections and monitoring and watering all plants to assure adequate moisture. The summer schedule brings in mosquito control, the painting and maintenance projects, as well as adding any new fixtures to the parks all before getting ready for River Days. The Seasonal Summer Maintenance position usually ends in August so it is back to one person to keep up with mowing, trimming, fall weed control and eventually fall clean up. Autumn is also when trees and shrubs are added to the parks. Winter brings snow and ice removal as well as building ice in the rinks and coordinating warming house supervision. The winter season also brings inside projects such as building picnic tables, equipment maintenance and of course the training classes for the certifications. Before you know it the ice rinks are melting and we are back to searching for candidates for the Seasonal Maintenance position!

**CONSUMER CONFIDENCE  
DRINKING WATER  
REPORT**

Water suppliers that serve the same people year-round must prepare annual water quality reports (Consumer Confidence Reports—CCR) for their customers. The first reports were due in October 1999, and from then on they came out in June of each year. The reports tell where drinking water comes from, what is in it and how you can help protect it.

**T A L L G R A S S & N O X I O U S W E E D S**

The city has an ordinance regulating the height of grass. The ordinances state that grass shall not exceed 12" and all noxious weeds and other rank growths of vegetation upon public or private property must be removed.

Typically 5 days are given for tall grass and less if there are noxious weeds.

**S W I M M I N G P O O L S**

All swimming pools with a capacity of five thousand (5,000) gallons and a depth greater than thirty (30) inches requires a permit and a yearly inspection. Contact City Hall if you need to apply for a permit.

**L A W N S P R I N K L E R S**

Residents installing a lawn sprinkler system need to apply for a building permit before installation. A site plan with the proposed placement needs to be submitted with the permit and fee. The permit fee is \$51.00.

**\*The City has an even/odd watering ban which is determined by your address, for instance, if your address is an odd number, you may water outdoors on odd numbered days of the month.**
