**CITY OF ROCKFORD
WATER / WASTEWATER OPERATOR**

The Water Department is responsible for the operation, maintenance, and budgeting regarding the cities 3 water storage tanks, 5 pumps, chemical feed equipment, water distribution system with associated valves, pipe, hydrants, and metering systems. Daily laboratory work, along with weekly, quarterly, and annual testing is conducted to ensure proper operation of the water system along with recordkeeping including daily, monthly, and annual reporting to the MDH and DNR as required by law. The Water Operator is licensed thru the Minnesota Department of Health and maintains licensing thru continuing education. The Water Department is recognized annually for water quality.

The Wastewater Department is responsible for the operation, maintenance, permit writing/ permit compliance and budgeting regarding the cities 4 satellite lift stations, collection system, main lift station, grit removal system, fine screen system, 2 retrofitted biological Extended Aeration Activated Sludge Package Plants with associated equipment, chemical feed equipment for the reduction of Total Phosphorus, Ultraviolet Disinfection system and Biosolids holding/removal. Daily laboratory work along with weekly, quarterly, biannual, and annual tests are conducted to ensure proper operation of the wastewater system and daily, monthly, and annual reports are completed to determine compliance with our permit issued by the MPCA. The Wastewater Operator is licensed thru the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency and must maintain the licensing thru continued education. Since 2011 the current Water/Wastewater Operator has received 4 of the 5 Certificate of Commendations issued by the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency. Doug Duda has been awarded the highest level of licenses issued to operators in the State of Minnesota.

The Water/Wastewater Departments monitor the systems 24/7/365 thru alarm call in systems and on site monitoring.

The Wastewater Department is urging residents to discontinue flushing wipes, even though they claim to be flushable. These include disinfectant wipes, make up removing wipes, glass cleaning wipes etc. These products do not break down properly and are causing an increase in maintenance costs and possible equipment upgrades which come with downfalls not including increased costs of the equipment itself. Backups in basements are happening along with plugged pumps, partial plugged pumps which can increase electric costs of thousands of dollars and are difficult to detect, and plugging the wastewater plants themselves which can cause the city to violate its permit to discharge. There is technology to protect the plants better but this is very expensive (6 digits figure) and the wastewater department would like to resolve this problem with public education. The wastewater system is designed to treat what comes from your digestive tract and only toilet paper is designed to be handled by the system. We ask that all other items be disposed of in the trash to be taken to the landfills.

C O M P O S T S I T E

The compost site on Elm Street/CR 33 is scheduled to open to City of Rockford Residents on *Monday, April 16th, depending on the weather.*

Items accepted: grass clippings, leaves and brush no larger than 3” in diameter. All bags used to transport composting must be removed.

Please observe the following guidelines:

- Please remove all bags, bottles and flower pots.
- Yard waste mixed with rocks, metal, concrete, polystyrene foam, animal feces or foreign material is unacceptable.
- Landscape fabric does not decompose and is not allowed at the compost site.
- Grass clippings, leaves, garden waste and all soft bodied plant material is acceptable for the compost pile.
- Brush, sticks and wood waste need to be separated from compostable yard waste. Woody plant material does not degrade as fast as soft bodied plants and needs to be handled separately

All wood waste and brush needs to be placed in the brush pile which is separate from the compost pile. The city hires a contractor to remove the wood waste from the site every fall. Please observe the following rules to help keep this cost minimal for the city:

- No stumps
- No lumber or landscape timbers
- No concrete
- No logs over 6” in diameter
- Place all leaves and grass clippings in the compost pile.

Hours of operation:
Monday-Friday 7:30am-3:00pm
Wednesday Evening 4:30-8:30pm
Saturday 8:00am-noon

The compost site schedule is subject to weather and site conditions. Only material originating within the city limits is allowed at the site. No commercial lawn care or tree companies are allowed at the site. The site may also be closed if an illegal dumping creates a problem that needs to be corrected.

You do not need to check out a key at city hall.

NO OTHER DUMPING IS ALLOWED.

Finished compost material is available to Rockford Residents.

Park Commission Openings - the Park Commission meets every other month on the 1st Monday at 6pm. Applications available on-line or at City Hall.

**S I N G L E S O R T
R E C Y C L I N G**

Waste Management **collects recycling every other Wednesday.** The 2018 calendar is available on the City website or at City Hall.

Recyclables must be set out at the curb by 7 a.m. Face the lid toward the street and the handle toward the house.

Items for recycle: metal cans, plastic bottles & containers #1-7, glass bottles & jars, paper, flattened cardboard & paperboard, and dairy & juice cartons.

DO NOT INCLUDE: plastic bags, sharps & medical waste (needles), foam cups & containers or food waste.

The City of Rockford supports residential recycling in the general fund budget. Recycling was state mandated by legislature. The more everyone can recycle the bigger the county rebates, reducing the tax burden.
